Mark D. Kielsingard is a 10 year resident of Key West and an adjunct professor of law, professor of international studies and a former law partner with Love, Kielsingard and Associates. He served as a trial and appellate lawyer who handled approximately 2000 cases, argued several matters before the Virginia Supreme Court and had a case of first impression before the U.S. Court of Appeals. He received his JD from Rutgers University Law School and LL.M. from St. Thomas University School of Law and is currently completing his JSD in International Human Rights Law. Mr. Kielsingard has studied abroad in Austria, the Netherlands and Ireland, and is a Marie Curie Scholar from Leiden University. He has published several lead articles in academic journals -- translated in up to four languages -- in the areas of international security law, human rights, international criminal law, genocide, and international economic policy. He is finalizing his first book, which deals with the International Criminal Court, and has lectured and made presentations on human rights, civilian oversight of police, and terrorism before the American Civil Liberties Union and other groups.
