Eaton St. Scope of Work

- 2" Mill and Pave Asphalt Overlay
- From Simonton St. to White St.
- Project Duration – 1 Week
- Project will start Monday, August 15th
- Striping and Parking to Remain as Existing



Eaton St. Project Information

- Eaton St. is a County Road, with City sewer infrastructure underneath
- Cost of Project will be shared by both entities
- Project was chosen for mid-August to minimize impact to residents and businesses

- City and County Inspectors will be on site during construction




Parking & Trash/Recycling

- Parking not allowed on Eaton St. during construction
- All cars should be removed from Eaton St. by 7 AM Monday, Aug 15th.
- Any cars still on street will be towed
- Driveway parking on Eaton St. will be coordinated with construction crew and City inspectors.
- Free parking during construction for Eaton St. residents in Park and Ride Lot on Caroline St.
- Place Trash/Recycling curbside on regular days



STORMWATER MASTER PLAN

- GIS Mapping of Existing Infrastructure
- LIDAR Satellite Imagery
- Storm Modeling Performed for 5-year, 10-year, 25-year, and 100-year storm events
- Does not include storm surge events, as they are impossible to model.



STORMWATER MASTER PLAN

- List of capital improvements generated based on frequency of flooding
- This scientifically-based capital project list will guide our future construction schedule.
- Study will incorporate historical flooding concerns from residents
