



FDOT PROJECT UPDATES – Week of October 21, 2013 (Key West through Layton)

All work schedules are subject to change due to weather or unforeseen circumstances

PROJECT: **NORTH ROOSEVELT BOULEVARD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT**

Project Start: April 23, 2012

Projected Completion: July 2014

Day #: 543 of 820

Time Progress: 66.2%

WORK SCHEDULED FOR NEXT TWO WEEKS: Sheet pile installation has been completed; seawall cap construction will continue. Drainage work will continue throughout the project, as will drilling for the new traffic light mastarm bases and laying of conduit for signals and lighting. Curbing, sidewalk and paving work will continue.

The sidewalk/promenade is open from the south end of the Salt Run Channel bridge to Palm Avenue. The remainder of the sidewalk/promenade remains closed and all bicycle/pedestrian traffic will continue to use the dedicated lane separated by concrete barrier and fencing. Please use caution.

Bicyclists and pedestrians: Please use extra caution during this transition to the new traffic pattern. There will be a lot of equipment in the construction zone and the bike/pedestrian lane will be shifting .

TRAFFIC SHIFT: On October 12, traffic was shifted to the 'water side' of North Roosevelt Boulevard, beginning at the south end of the Salt Run Channel bridge all the way to Palm Avenue.

NIGHT TIME WORK: Night time work may occur at any time during the project.

NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN REMINDER: Two-way traffic with a center lane is in effect on North Roosevelt Boulevard. Drivers are encouraged to be patient and courteous and expect some delays as we adjust to the new patterns.

PROJECT: BAHIA HONDA BRIDGE REPAIR (mm 35.5 to 36.6)

Project Start: June 2013
Projected Completion: December 2014
Day #: 154 of 560
Time Progress: 27.5%

WORK SCHEDULED FOR NEXT TWO WEEKS: Contractor is working on pile jackets and rebar replacement. The majority of the work will be done on the water and should not interfere with traffic. The public is welcome to fish in the area. However, they are asked not to use the driveway or staging area for fishing.

NIGHT TIME WORK/LANE CLOSURES: No nighttime or lane closures are scheduled.

PROJECT: GRASSY KEY TO LAYTON (mm 59.9 to mm 68.25) RESURFACING AND SHOULDER WIDENING

Project Start: April 2013
Projected Completion: December 2013
Day #: 170 of 260
Time Progress: 65.4%

WORK SCHEDULED FOR NEXT TWO WEEKS: Shoulder widening and resurfacing will continue.

NIGHT TIME WORK/LANE CLOSURES: None scheduled.

PROJECT: RAMROD TO BIG PINE KEY (mm 27.4 to 29.5) RESURFACING PROJECT

Project Start: August 12, 2013
Projected Completion: December 2013
Day #: 68 of 150
Time Progress: 45.3%

WORK SCHEDULED FOR NEXT TWO WEEKS: Shoulder milling and widening, painting on the bridge.

NIGHT TIME WORK/LANE CLOSURES: Shoulder closures this week. Right turn lanes in the project (SR 4A, Kings Cove Rd., Middle Torch Rd., Barry Ave.) will continue to be closed, as work continues.

PROJECT: SADDLEBUNCH KEYS (mm 11.3 to 14.6 and mm 15.2 to 15.9)

Project Start: September 16, 2013
Projected Completion: February 2014
Day #: 26 of 140
Time Progress: 23.6%

WORK SCHEDULED FOR NEXT TWO WEEKS: Bridge coating will continue.

NIGHT TIME WORK/LANE CLOSURES: Shoulder closures schedule will continue during the bridge coating.

PROJECT: OHIO-MISSOURI CHANNEL BRIDGE REPAIR (mm 39.1 to 39.4)

Project Start: September 30, 2013
Projected Completion: November 4, 2014
Day #: 14 of 400
Time Progress: 305%

WORK SCHEDULED FOR NEXT TWO WEEKS: Mobilization, traffic shifts.

NIGHT TIME WORK/LANE CLOSURES: There will be a lane closure on the Gulf side of the bridge from MM 39.1 to MM 39.4 beginning Monday, October 28. Traffic will be shifted to the ocean side of the bridge for approximately 4 months for construction work on the bridge.

FDOT PROJECT UPDATES – Week of October 21, 2013

(Key Largo)

PROJECT: SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway in Key Largo (mm 99.6 to 106.3)

There will be intermittent single-lane closures along **SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway in Key Largo** in the northbound direction, from Mile Marker 99 to Mile Marker 103 for shoulder pavement and turn lane widening from **Monday, October 21, 2013 to Friday, October 25, 2013**. The lane closures will occur **between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.** and will allow the contractor to safely widen the shoulders.

Nighttime lane closures may also occur in both the north bound and south bound direction, between Mile Marker 99 and Mile Marker 106 **from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.** for milling and paving operations.

There will not be any lane closures in the vicinity of Key Largo Elementary School, located on Mile Marker 105, during any of these time periods. However, shoulder closures may occur anywhere between Mile Marker 99 and Mile Marker 106 at any time to safely allow the contractor to reconstruct the Heritage Trail and widen the existing shoulders.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
